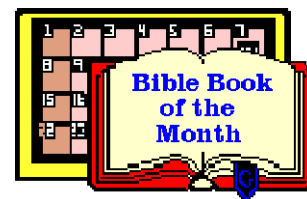
## Visit from NE-GMC Bishop & Superintendent

## November - Bible Book of the Month - Joshua

I would like to remind you that our Bible books of the month are always invitations and not requirements. If you sense the Lord is leading you to read and meditate on other Scriptures, please do not feel obligated to read the Bible Book of the Month. I simply offer the book of the month as one means by which the Holy Spirit can be used to guide your time in God's written Word.



Joshua is a book of fulfillments. The promises the Lord gives to Abraham in Genesis find their fulfillment in this important book. As you read Joshua this month, here are a few themes to keep in mind.

**First, God is a faithful, promise-keeping God.** Things may not always happen in the timing that we would like, but God is at work and His promises will be fulfilled. So please continue to faithfully lean in to God's promises in your life, as you continue to follow Christ in whatever circumstances you are walking through at present.

**Second, this book reminds us to look to our Triune God for His leading and His power in order to accomplish His purposes.** The Lord wanted Israel to trust in Him to direct their steps as they entered the Promised Land. Let us all allow our Lord to direct our steps as well.

**Third, remember Joshua 24:15 "as for me and my household, we will serve the Lord."** Friends, we cannot control anyone, but we can choose to serve the Lord each day. Our faithfulness to Christ will impact not only our household, but also all we come into contact with. So let us choose to serve the Lord each day.

**And fourth and finally, please note that the name Jesus and the name Joshua are actually the same name – just in different languages.** This name means the Lord is salvation. Joshua's name was originally Hoshea (meaning 'desire for salvation'), but Moses actually changed Hoshea's name to Joshua as a reminder that the LORD was the One who would save them from slavery in Egypt (See Numbers 13:16). When our God would later become human, there would be no better name for Him to be given than Jesus/Joshua, for in Him people would find salvation from the LORD from our sins (See Matthew 1:21). So may this book remind us that we have a great Savior in Jesus. And again, may we choose to allow Him to lead us each and every day.

December's Bible Book of the Month will be *Romans*.

## My Life-Changing Year with Devotions on F.I.R.E.

- Testimony from **Kyra Gerber**: Participating in the *Devotions on F.I.R.E.* year-long Bible reading plan has been a life-changing experience for me. I knew from the start that committing to a daily devotional would be something new and challenging—but I also knew I wanted to grow deeper in my relationship with God.

My faith journey has been one I've intentionally worked on over the past few years. I grew up surrounded by faith—going to church, attending VBS, youth groups, and other church activities. I'm blessed to have parents who centered their lives around God and led our family to do the same. But when I went to college, I faced life experiences that could have easily pulled me away from my faith. Instead, I chose to press in and draw closer to God.

During college, I started doing devotionals regularly because they reminded me that I wasn't alone, even when I felt like I was. Since then, I've had seasons where I struggled to stay consistent. Like many people, I used to think I "didn't have time" to read my Bible every day. But this past year has taught me that we *all* have time—we just have to be willing to make it. And when we do, everything changes.

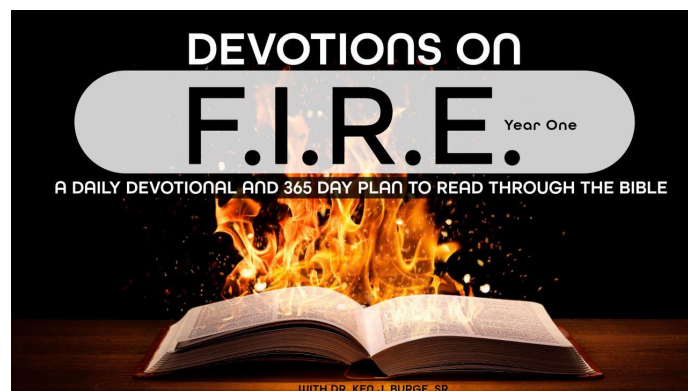
Looking back, I wish I had stuck with daily devotionals sooner. There were stretches when I didn't open my Bible for days or even weeks, and I felt the difference. But I'm incredibly grateful for Blain and everyone in our devotional group who has walked through this journey with me. Thanks to the support and accountability of this amazing group, we're now just a few weeks away from completing the *entire Bible* in one year. That's something I never thought I'd be able to say—and I've never felt closer to God.

If you're looking to grow in your relationship with God or want to read through the Bible for the first time, I *highly* recommend joining the *Year in the Bible* group for 2026. I personally plan to keep going each year, digging deeper into God's Word and learning more each time.

All it takes is discipline—and a strong community to walk alongside you. If you're interested or have questions, please reach out to me, Blain, my parents, or anyone else who has been a part of this journey. We'd love to share what worked for us and encourage you in your walk with God.

- Testimony from **Joel Doherty**: Almost 300 days ago we were invited to download the Bible app and read the Bible in one year. I had been trying to read the Bible from cover to cover for over a year at that point. My goal of completing the Bible before getting baptized seemed unattainable with my reading comprehension difficulties.

The Holy Bible app changed that. Having the ability to follow along or just listen while driving to work made it an enjoyable experience. Starting this with a group also helped me hold myself accountable, some weeks I really needed that. This has really helped my relationship with God and the church. It's hard to believe we have just two months left. I hope others join next year. This year I read the NASB 1995 and next year I plan to read another translation.



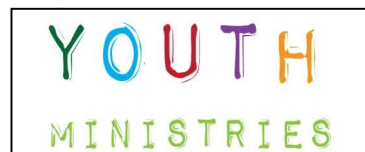

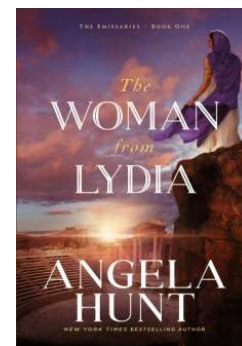
Our book study for Monday, **November 10** will be "King's Shadow" (by Angela Hunt). Two women occupy a place in Herod's court. The first, Salome, is the king's only sister, a resentful woman who has been told she's from an inferior race, a people whom God will never accept or approve of. The second woman, Zara, is a lowly handmaid who serves Salome, but where Salome spies conspiracies and treachery, Zara sees hurting people in need of understanding and compassion. Powerful and powerless, Idumean and Jew, selfish and selfless--both women struggle to reach their goals and survive each day within Herod the Great's tumultuous court, where no one is trustworthy and no one is safe.

Our book study for **January 12, 2026** will be "The Woman from Lydia" (by Angela Hunt). Hector, a retired Roman soldier, settles in Philippi with Lucius, his comrade in arms; three slaves; and his dreams of finally achieving wealth and status. His hopes are dashed, however, when an itinerant Jewish missionary robs Hector's youngest slave of her ability to foretell the future.

Widowed Euodia, known to her neighbors as "the Lydian woman," struggles to make a fresh start in a foreign city. She finds new purpose in life when she meets Paulos, apostle to the Gentiles, and is honored when he establishes a fledgling church in her home. When she realizes that Sabina, the slave girl who is now useless in the eyes of her owners, is being abused, she buys the girl from Lucius, intending to set her free.

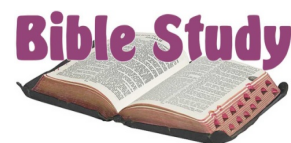
But when Hector discovers that the slave has been sold, he swears he will restore her lucrative ability . . . even if he must travel to the ends of the earth to find someone with similar gifts from the gods. Following close behind him, Euodia and her servants set out to rescue the girl, not for gain, but for compelling reasons of the heart.
