A Message from The Pastor - Passing It On



As I write this article, the World Cup is now in full swing. Nations around the world are excited to cheer on their country and eager to celebrate success.

Some people were even willing and able to travel to North America to support their nation from places all over the world. The passion and enthusiasm and zeal are very evident. And when there is a success for one's team, jubilation results! And the celebration is contagious.

Sermon Series

On June 7th we began a sermon series on ***The Gospel of John***. I hope to continue preaching through this Gospel until likely pausing for Advent. I invite your prayers for my study and planning for these services and that the Lord would minister powerfully within each of us as we unpack this amazing gospel together. I trust that our faith in Jesus will grow greatly through this journey.

Also, for us to better orient us to the overall Gospel of John, please take a moment to familiarize yourself with the overall outline of this gospel, as put together by Dr. Doug Buckwalter. I believe that better grasping the big picture of what John was seeking to do in his gospel will help us to better grasp the many stories that he includes within it. If you would be interested in a paper or electronic copies of this outline of the gospel, please let me know and I would be happy to get that to you.

The Gospel of John—Literary Structure

H. Douglas Buckwalter

I. OVERALL STRUCTURE

- A the Gospel Prologue: salvation is the exclusive work and goal of Jesus' first coming** ("the True Light was coming into the world," 1:9; "he came unto his own," 1:11; "the Word became flesh," 1:14) (1:1–18)
 - believing in/receiving Jesus Christ mandated (1:12)
- B testimony about Jesus, especially as the Christ (1:41) and the Son of God (1:34, 49), at the outset of his earthly ministry (1:19–51)**
 - the Holy Spirit's coming upon Jesus (1:32–34) divinely confirms this identity of him as true
 - ends: Jesus states that the disciples will see much greater revelation about him and from him in his upcoming earthly ministry [as is then recounted in the body of the Gospel] (1:50–51)
- C Jesus' public ministry (e.g., 7:26; 8:26) illustrates Israel's overall unbelief in him and that he was none other than God's very own Son (2:1–12:50)**
 - opens: in 2:1–12, John records ⁽¹⁾Jesus' miracle of changing water to wine at the wedding feast in Cana of Galilee and that this was the first of the sign miracles Jesus performed; ⁽²⁾it revealed his glory; ⁽³⁾his disciples believed in him (2:11)
 - closes: in 12:37b–50, John records that ⁽¹⁾many sign miracles Jesus performed (12:37); ⁽²⁾Isaiah envisioned his glory (12:41); but ⁽³⁾most of the Jews did not believe in him (12:37)
- D CENTER: the last supper (13:1–17:26)**
 - Jesus privately reveals through instruction and deed that he is the perfect high priest to his own who are in the world (13:1)
 - begins: Jesus wants to show the disciples "the full depth of his love for them" (13:1)
 - ends: Jesus prays for his followers "that the love which you [God] loved me [Jesus] may also be in them" (17:26)
- C' Jesus' passion work (e.g., 19:20) climaxes Israel's overall unbelief in him and God's once-and-for-all redemptive purpose in sending His Son (18:1–19:42)**
 - opens: Jesus goes out of Jerusalem to a garden with his disciples (18:1)
 - closes: Jesus is put in a tomb in the garden by Joseph of Arimathea, a secret disciple of Jesus, near where he was crucified (19:38–42)
- B' testimony about Jesus, especially as the Christ (20:31) and the Son of God (20:31), at the conclusion of his earthly ministry (20:1–31)**
 - Jesus' resurrection (ch. 20) divinely confirms this identity of him as true
 - ends: John states that the disciples had personally witnessed all that was revealed about Jesus and from Jesus during his now completed earthly career [as has been recounted up to this point in the body of the Gospel] (20:30–31)
- A' the Gospel Epilogue: sanctification is the exclusive work and goal of Jesus' ongoing ministry until his second coming** ("If I wish him to remain until I come, what is that to you? You follow me!" 21:19, 21) (21:1–25)
 - following Jesus mandated (21:22)

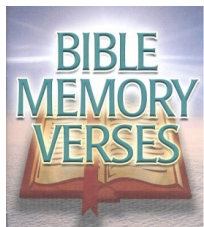

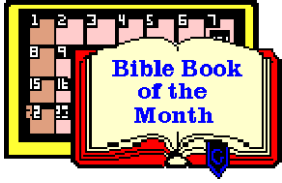


Youth Group

July - Bible Book of the Month - 1 Kings



In this month of July, we are blessed to take a journey through the Book of **1 Kings**. Technically, 1 & 2 Kings were written as one large book, but due to its size, it was eventually treated as two books. This month we will be focusing just on 1 Kings.

The book of 1 Kings begins with the Kingdom of Israel in the pinnacle of its strength, size, and power. King David has reigned successfully and he passes the kingship to his son, Solomon. King Solomon's reign begins well. He asks God for wisdom, which the LORD is pleased to give him. Solomon builds the beautiful Temple to the LORD in Jerusalem. And Israel is also at peace with all other nations.

But sadly, sin begins to rear its ugly head within the nation of Israel. (Sin still has that effect today.) Solomon begins to drift away from his devotion to the LORD by choosing to also worship the gods of his pagan wives. The LORD then became angry with Solomon and raised up adversaries to humble Solomon and seek to call Solomon back to faithfulness to God.

God also brought about a division within Israel, making it into two nations. David and Solomon's line continued to reign as kings of Judah, but ten of the other tribes formed a new nation called Israel. The remainder of 1 Kings describes the reigns of various kings from Judah and Israel. The book also includes much of the powerful ministry of the prophet Elijah and the beginnings of the ministry of the prophet Elisha. Their ministries are a reminder that even when culture seems to be on a downward spiral, the LORD is always seeking to bring revival and renewal to His people. Truly, our God does not give up on people easier. We can all say amen to that!

This Book of Kings is filled with many implications for today. First, it serves as a reminder of the importance of living in faithfulness to the LORD. While Israel predominately failed in its calling to be a light on a hill sharing the love of God, we as God's people today are warned to live in faithfulness to God. Second, this book should cause us to pray for our leaders (in the church, in government, in our families). When leaders fall, it has huge implications for many others. Conversely, when leaders are godly there are positive implications that impact many people as a result. So please pray for the leaders in your life. Third, even in the midst of Israel's downward spiral, it is important to remember that God was at work in powerful ways among them. It is a reminder that no matter what is going on around us and within us, the Lord desires to powerfully work in us and through us. May God bless your reading of 1 Kings!

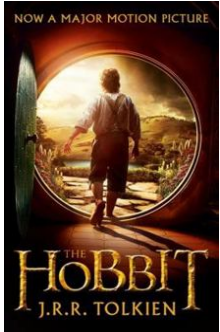

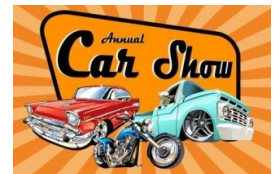


Our book study for **September 14** is ***“The Hobbit”*** (by J.R.R. Tolkien). In a hole in the ground, there lived a hobbit. So begins one of the most beloved and delightful tales in the English language. Set in the imaginary world of Middle-earth, at once a classic myth and a modern fairy tale, J.R.R. Tolkien's *The Hobbit* is one of literature's most enduring and well-loved novels. Bilbo Baggins is a hobbit who enjoys a comfortable, unambitious life, rarely traveling any farther than his pantry or cellar. But his contentment is disturbed when the wizard Gandalf and a company of dwarves arrive on his doorstep one day to whisk him away on an adventure. They have launched a plot to raid the treasure hoard guarded by Smaug the Magnificent, a large and very dangerous dragon. Bilbo reluctantly joins their quest, unaware that on his journey to the Lonely Mountain he will encounter both a magic ring and a frightening creature known as Gollum. Written for Tolkien's own children, *The Hobbit* has sold many millions of copies worldwide and established itself as a modern classic.

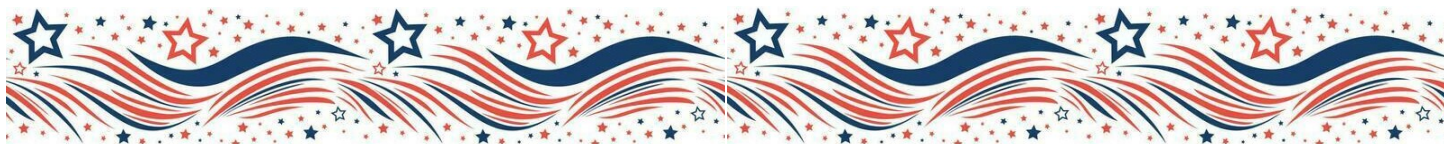
