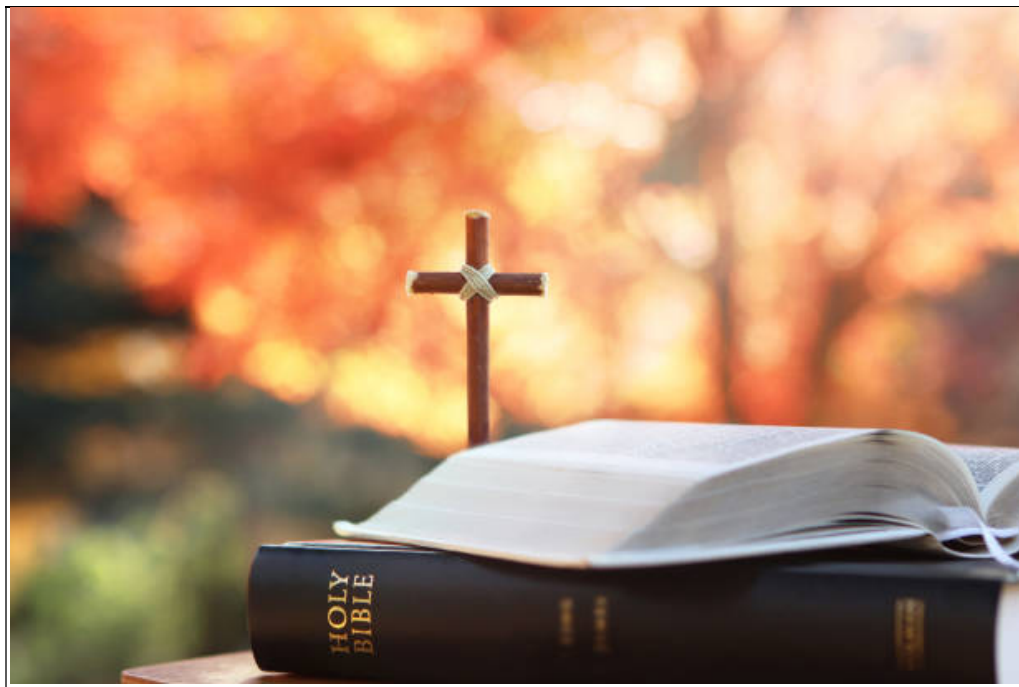

### **A Message from The Pastor - Remembering Our Vows**

Chestnut Grove Church will be blessed to have new members officially join our church this Sunday, August 30! This is always a beautiful thing, as professions of faith or reaffirmations of faith are made, in addition to baptisms taking place and baptisms remembered with gratitude. It will be a day that is celebrated on earth and in heaven and will always be remembered by our Lord!

One of the beautiful things that takes place during these moments is everyone is invited to reaffirm their vows of membership. Our vows are to support God's church through our prayers, our presence, our gifts, our service, and our witness. These vows should remind us that each and every believer is called to full-time ministry, so to speak. Each and every one of us has an important role to play in God's Kingdom and in the life of Christ's Church.

When we choose to be intentional in living into these vows, we will experience growth in our relationship with Jesus. This fall season typically functions in our country as a sort of academic new year. With that in mind, I believe that this is a very fitting time to reflect on our vows and ask for the Holy Spirit's help to continue making strides to live into them more fully.

I would like to touch briefly on each of these vows. The first vow is to pray regularly for the church. This vow cannot be overstated in its importance. We are called to be a praying church. Every single one of us is called to prayer regularly and fervently. I would very much appreciate your prayers for me and my family as your pastor. And your prayers for everyone in our church family are very important to the health of the church. Pray also for the leaders in the Global Methodist Church and Christian leaders throughout the world, for our communities where we live, for governmental leaders and our military, and for your family. Our prayers are powerful in the hands of our almighty God!

Second, we are called to be present. This means that, health permitting, we are to be actively attending worship regularly and seeking to be actively involved in the life of the church. We grow as the church best when we grow in Christ together.

Third, we are to offer our gifts unto the Lord. This includes joyfully giving to God through the church offering, but also have a heart that is eager to bless others in other ways as well (i.e. giving of time, offering skills and talents, etc.). Our God is a very generous God and God's people are called to reflect Him in this way.

Fourth, we make the vow of service. We are to live as servants of Christ and servants of one another. Often, this takes the form of volunteering in one way or another in helping the church to better flourish. There are many ways that we can serve and be in ministry to one another.

And fifth and finally, we vow to be a witness for Jesus. This means that we are to represent Jesus well. We do this by how we live and interact with others. We are to keep this in mind in how we speak with others outside the church. Are our conversations seasoned with the salt of the Kingdom of God or sounding like the world? Are we looking for times to talk to others about the greatness of God and the good news of Jesus? Are we eager to invite others to participate in the life of the church in some way?

As we begin the newness of this fall season, I challenge each of you to spend some time in prayer asking the Lord to help you live into each of these vows in more intentional ways.

And then, as the Lord speaks to you, I encourage you to take those steps that He is prompting you to take. I am excited for what the Lord will do in each of you.

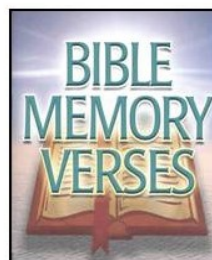

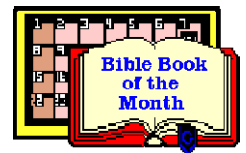
## Youth Group

## September - Bible Book of the Month - 2 Kings

This month's Bible book of the month is the books of **2 Kings**. 2 Kings picks up where 1 Kings left off (technically they were written as one longer book). The earlier chapters of 2 Kings focus on the concluding of the ministry of the prophet Elijah and then highlight the powerful ministry of the prophet Elisha. These ministries, and the ministries of other men and women of God, are meant to remind us that even in the most difficult times and the times when many are turning away from God, the Lord always has His people calling us to follow faithfully after the Lord.

The remaining chapters of 2 Kings describe the reigns of various kings in the northern kingdom of Israel and the southern kingdom of Judah. While there are times of repentance and revival, especially in the kingdom of Judah, sadly that was more of the exception than the norm. Eventually, both Israel and Judah were taken over and the people are largely taken in exile.

This Book of Kings is filled with many implications for today. First, it serves as a reminder of the importance of living in faithfulness to the LORD. While Israel predominately failed in its calling to be a light on a hill sharing the love of God, we as God's people today are warned to live in faithfulness to God. Second, this book should cause us to pray for our leaders (in the church, in government, in our families). When leaders fall, it has huge implications for many others. Conversely, when leaders are godly there are positive implications that impact many people as a result. So please pray for the leaders in your life. Third, even in the midst of Israel's downward spiral, it is important to remember that God was at work in powerful ways among them. Truly, no matter what is going on around us and within us, the Lord desires to powerfully work in us and through us. Let us choose to be faithful to Jesus and serve the Lord wholeheartedly.

May God bless your reading of 2 Kings this month and may it help strengthen your hope, faith, and love in our great Triune God.

October's Bible Book of the Month will be **Philippians**.

There will be a work day Saturday, **September 12** at Chestnut Grove Church. The work day will begin at 8:30AM.

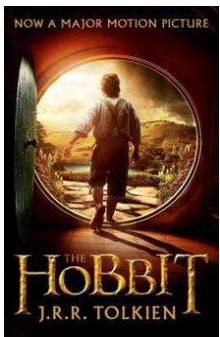


## Congregational Meeting (CHANGED) - September 13

## Book Study Group

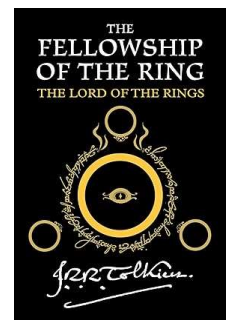

Our book study for **September 14** is ***"The Hobbit"*** (by J.R.R. Tolkien). In a hole in the ground, there lived a hobbit. So begins one of the most beloved and delightful tales in the English language. Set in the imaginary world of Middle-earth, at once a classic myth and a modern fairy tale, J.R.R. Tolkien's *The Hobbit* is one of literature's most enduring and well-loved novels. Bilbo Baggins is a hobbit who enjoys a comfortable, unambitious life, rarely traveling any farther than his pantry or cellar. But his contentment is disturbed when the wizard Gandalf and a company of dwarves arrive on his doorstep one day to whisk him away on an adventure. They have launched a plot to raid the treasure hoard guarded by Smaug the Magnificent, a large and very dangerous dragon. Bilbo reluctantly joins their quest, unaware that on his journey to the Lonely Mountain he will encounter both a magic ring and a frightening creature known as Gollum. Written for Tolkien's own children, *The Hobbit* has sold many millions of copies worldwide and established itself as a modern classic.

Our book study for **November 9** will be ***"The Fellowship Of The Ring: Being the First Part of The Lord of the Rings"*** (By J.R.R. Tolkien's). The Fellowship of the Ring is the first volume in J.R.R. Tolkien's epic high fantasy adventure, *The Lord of the Rings*.

In ancient times the Rings of Power were crafted by the Elven-smiths, and Sauron, the Dark Lord, forged the One Ring, filling it with his own power so that he could rule all others. But the One Ring was taken from him, and though he sought it throughout Middle-earth, it remained lost to him. After many ages it fell into the hands of Bilbo Baggins, as told in *The Hobbit*. In a sleepy village in the Shire, young Frodo Baggins finds himself faced with an immense task in this classic tale of good vs evil, as his elderly cousin Bilbo entrusts the Ring to his care. Frodo must leave his home and make a perilous journey across Middle-earth to the Cracks of Doom, there to destroy the Ring and foil the Dark Lord in his evil purpose.
